Independent review into Victorian racing industry victim support and complaint processes – Interim Report

The Racing Integrity Commissioner, Sean Carroll, has today released the <u>Interim Report and Progress Update</u> for the Independent Review into Victorian Racing Industry Victim Support and Complaint Processes (Review).

The Commissioner would like to acknowledge the contribution of the many former and current Victorian racing industry participants and administrators who have taken part in the Review thus far.

The Review will continue into the first half of 2023. All contributions are welcome up until the end of March next year. To take part via an in-person interview, online survey and/or written submission, you must be aged 18 years or older and:

- someone who works, or has previously worked, in thoroughbred, harness or greyhound racing in Victoria
- someone who volunteers, or has previously volunteered, in thoroughbred, harness or greyhound racing in Victoria
- an organisation or expert with relevant experience or expertise.

A final report of the Review will be published in June 2023. It will include detailed findings drawn from the de-identified accounts of people who have contributed to the Review, analysis of the information and data obtained about the experience of victim survivors, the processes and systems that are needed to better respond to their complaints, and recommendations about what the Victorian racing industry needs to improve.

"It is a privilege to be entrusted by those who have come forward as part of the Review to date. Their courage and dignity in candidly sharing their experience allows us to better understand what happened to them, how they have been let down, and make sure we do everything we can to support them.

"A trauma-informed approach is at the heart of safeguarding the wellbeing of everyone who takes part in the Review. The integrity and independence of the process and participant privacy and confidentiality are paramount.

"I strongly encourage anyone who has experienced, is experiencing, or has observed, physical and sexual assault and abuse and sexual harassment in the Victorian racing industry to come forward and take part.

"The Review is an historic opportunity to ensure that what happens away from the track is as important to the integrity of racing as what occurs on the track."
